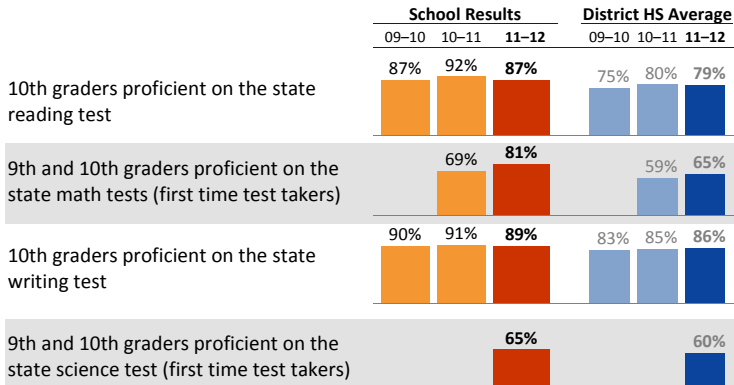

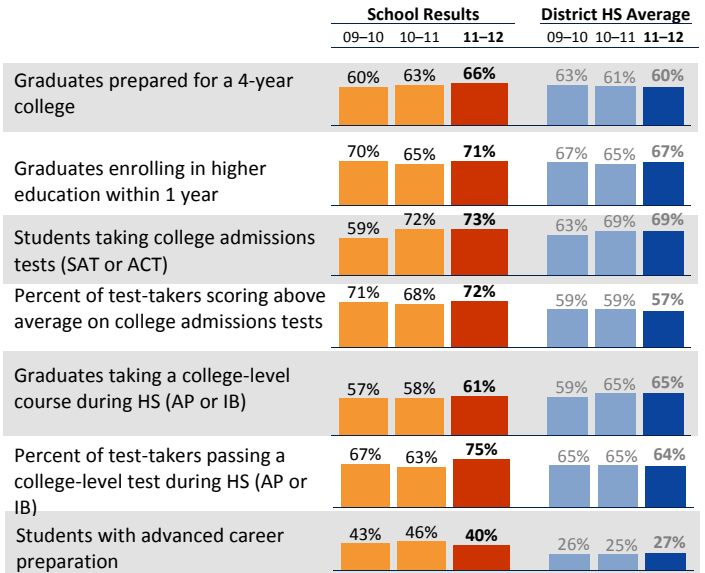

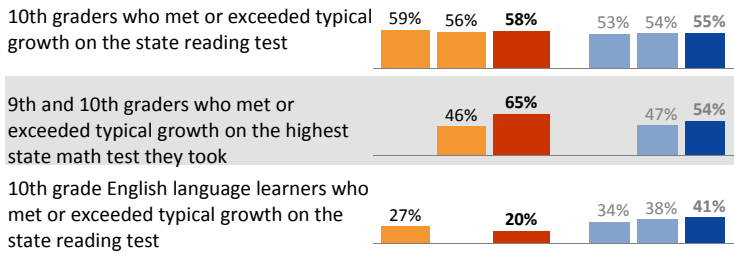

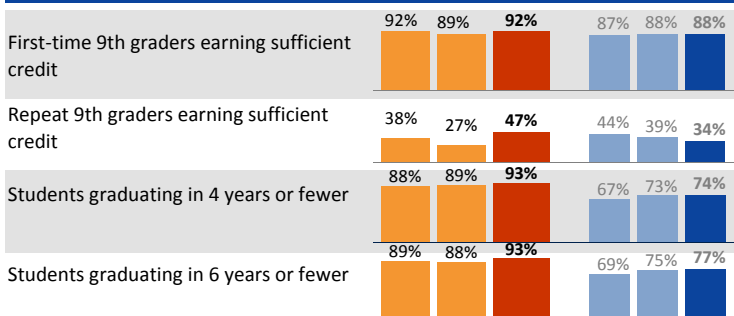


Year-to-Year Growth: Following the Same Students

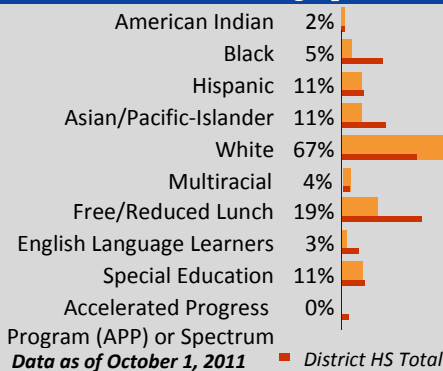
On-Track for Graduation



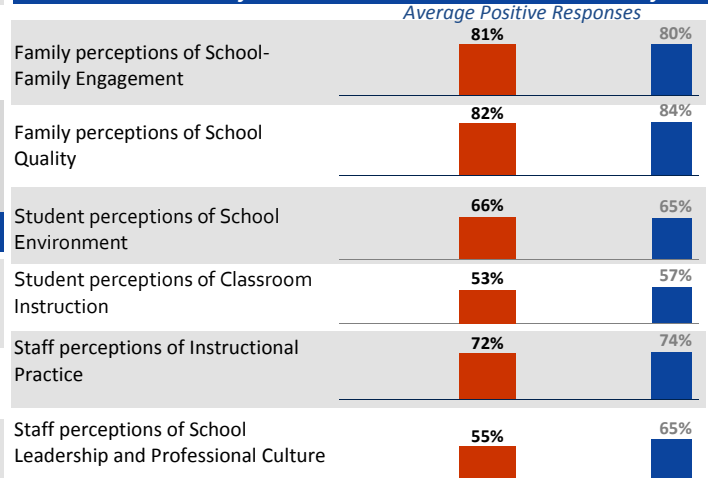
Attendance

School Mission Statement

"Ballard High School is an inclusive, supportive community that cultivates a tradition of excellence for all students."

School Goals

For 10th grade students we will increase the percentage of students at proficiency on the state science test from 55.3% to 70.3%, their proficiency on Math I EOC Exam from 79.8% to 82%, Math II EOC from 84.1% to 86.6%. For 10th grade students receiving Free and Reduced Lunch Services we will reduce the gap between students qualified for FRL and those who do not on the Math EOC I from 22.9% to 20% and from 17.8% to 14.8% in reading. Lastly, we will increase the number of repeat 9th graders earning at least five credits by Spring 2012 from 47% to 50%.

School Description and Plan to Achieve Goals

Ballard has taken a school wide focus on addressing struggling students. This means that classroom teachers are tracking the progress of their lowest students and implementing interventions. It also means that Administrators are intervening more quickly with attendance contracts and conferences with families and teachers.

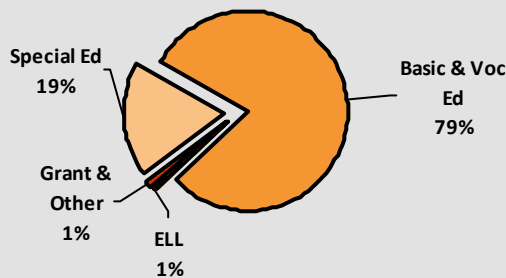
Math: We have created two classes of two hour long Algebra blocks for students that have struggled in math. These Intensive Algebra blocks should give students the extra time they need to improve their skills to prepare for the EOC I Exam. The teachers of these blocks have participated in the same trainings and have collaborated on the classes. Teachers collaborate at all math level to align instruction.

Reading: Ballard has a 15 minute Reading Period each day and 9th and 10th grade classes take part or all of one period per week to practice reading in the classroom. This practice time is vital to getting a chance to apply the strategies that they are taught.

Science: Greater alignment and collaboration between teachers of Physical Science and Biology continue to improve the performance of students on the state science assessment. As Science switches to a End of Course Biology Exam, the alignment of our Biology teachers will be vital to the success of our students.
