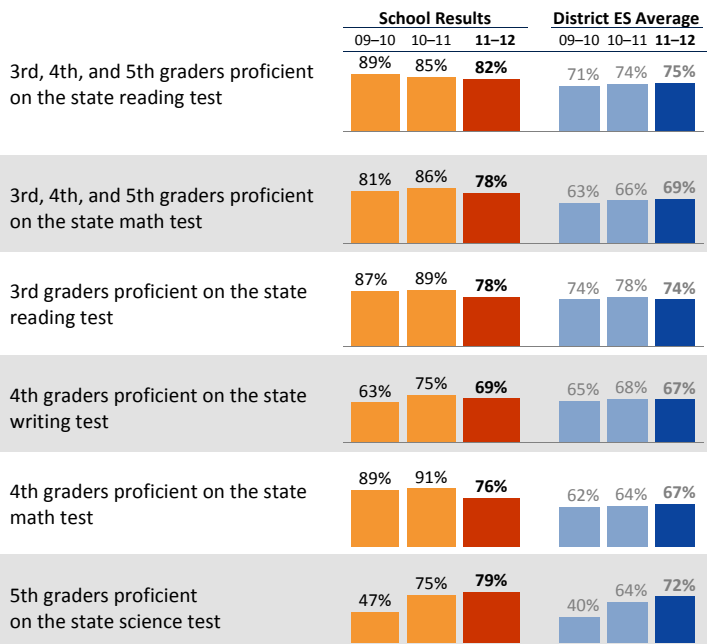

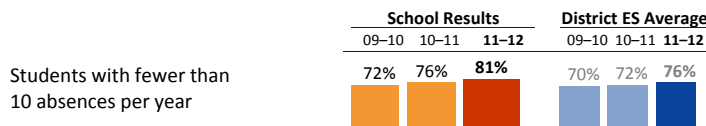

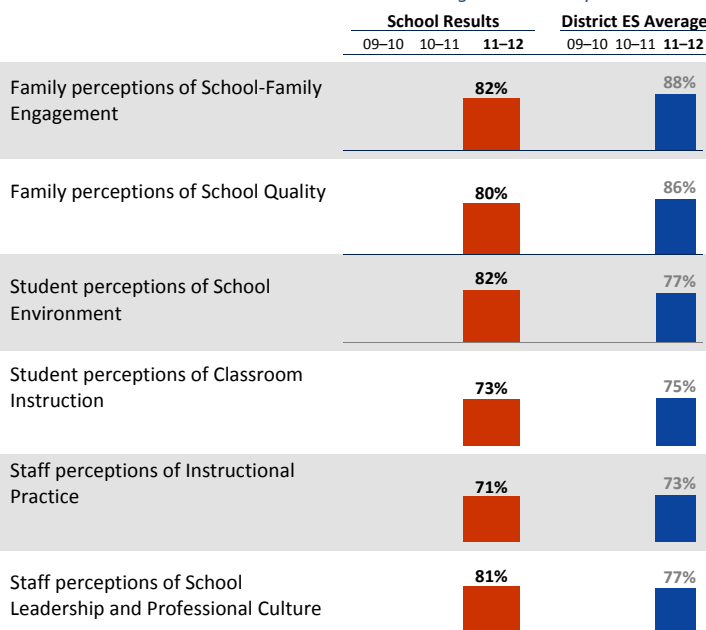

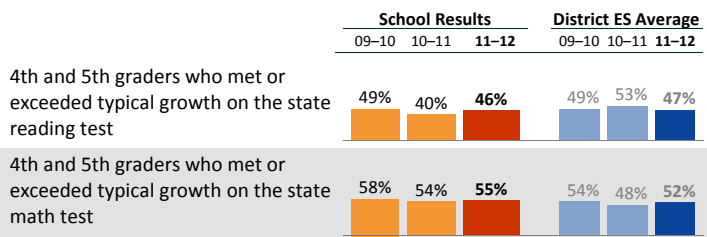

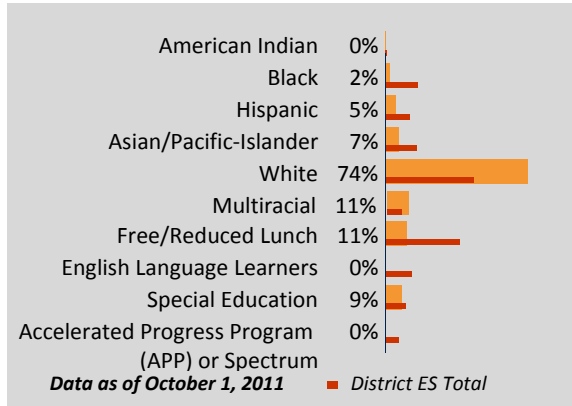
Year-to-Year Growth: Following the Same Students

School Mission Statement

Catharine Blaine is a K-8 school that provides a creative and challenging program for our students. We encourage every child to develop a love of learning, to appreciate diversity, and to reach his or her highest potential intellectually, socially, and ph

School Goals

To increase the % of students proficient on the state math test from 77.8% to 85% for 4th grade and 74% to 85% for 8th grade. To increase the % of students proficient on the state writing test from 69% to 80% for 4th grade and 83% to 88% for 7th grade. For 3rd grade students we will increase the % of students proficient on the state reading test from 77.8% to 100%. To increase the % of students proficient on the state science test from 78.9% to 80% for 5th grade and for the eighth graders to maintain or exceed 90% proficiency.

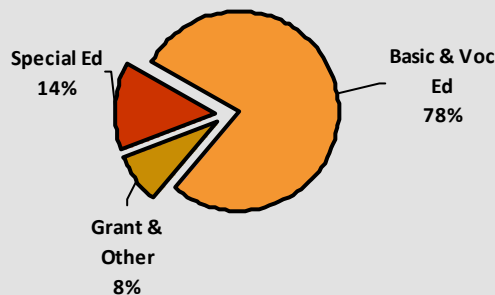
School Description and Plan to Achieve Goals

Math- Middle School math teachers will participate in District provided trainings around content delivery. General education math teachers will work collaboratively with Special Education staff and our Math Specialist to align materials and expectations. K-2 teachers will fully implement the Common Core Math Standards. Common preps will allow grade teams to meet with building specialists. Lead teachers will support teachers using the Re-Think materials. K-8 teachers will work with our math specialist to research supplemental materials to support students at both ends of the spectrum. In addition, the Math Specialist will develop a plan to implement workshop math to meet the needs of the various target groups.

Reading- Continued focus on building the K-3 team alignment around teaching with in the workshop model. Research a comprehensive word study program that can be used K-3 with fidelity to support the phonics development of all students K-3. Implement Guided Reading in the fifth grade. Assessments- Build a school-wide data dashboard and establish data "summits" to frequently progress monitor all students.

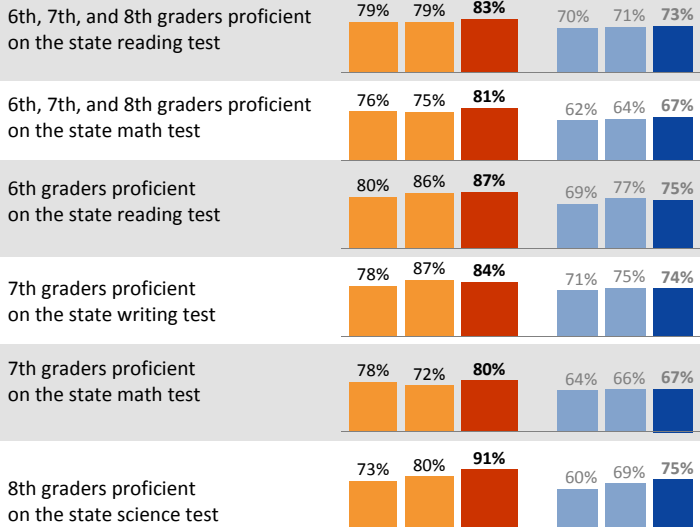

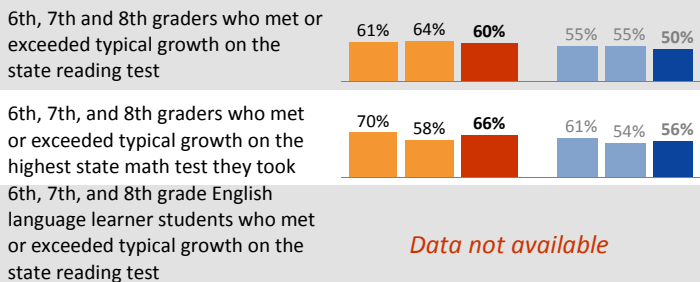

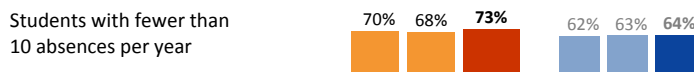
Year-to-Year Growth: Following the Same Students

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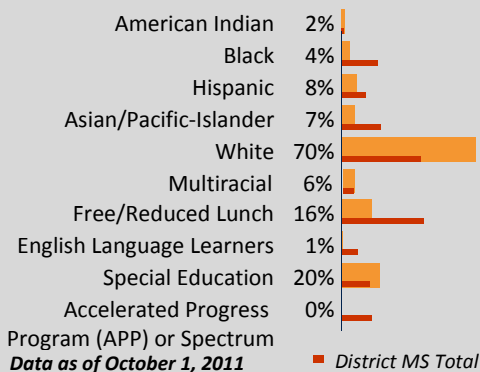

Student Demographics



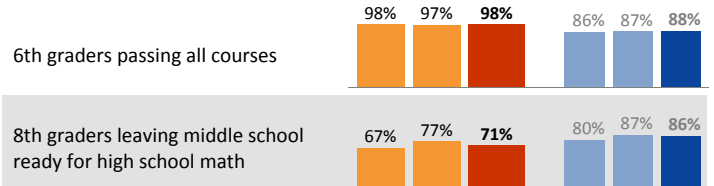

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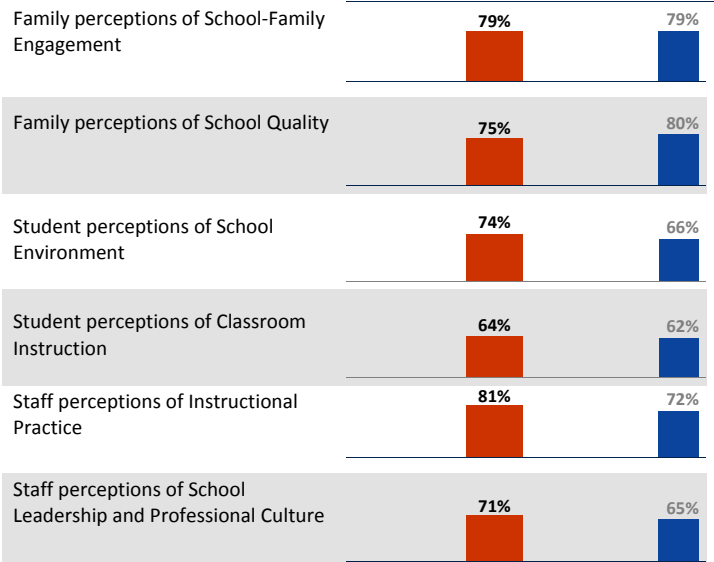

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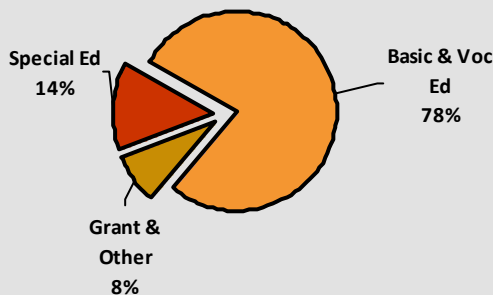
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
