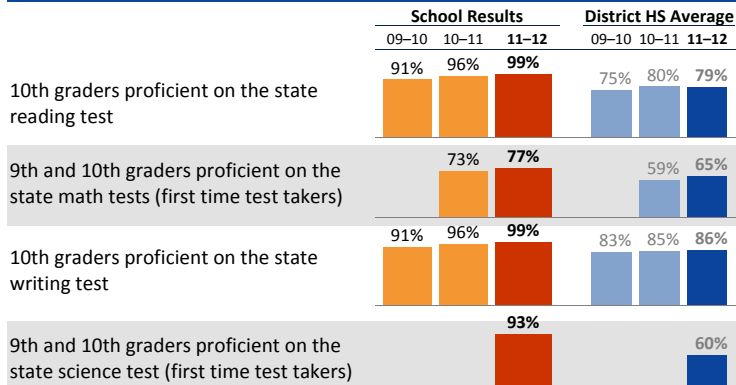

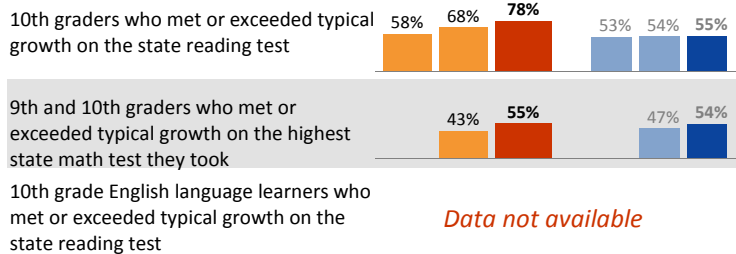

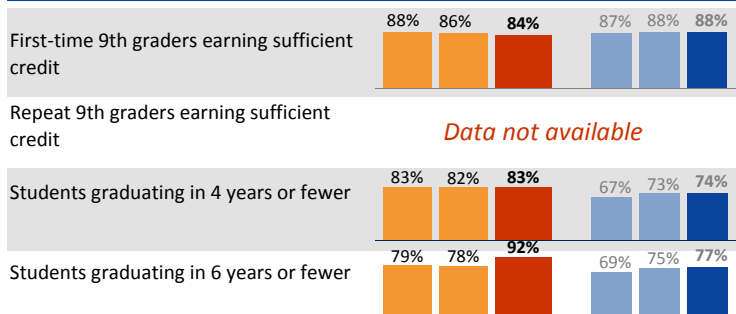


Year-to-Year Growth: Following the Same Students

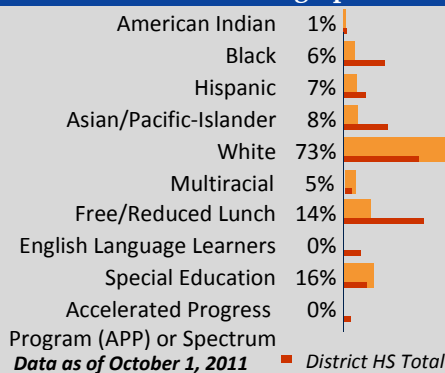
On-Track for Graduation



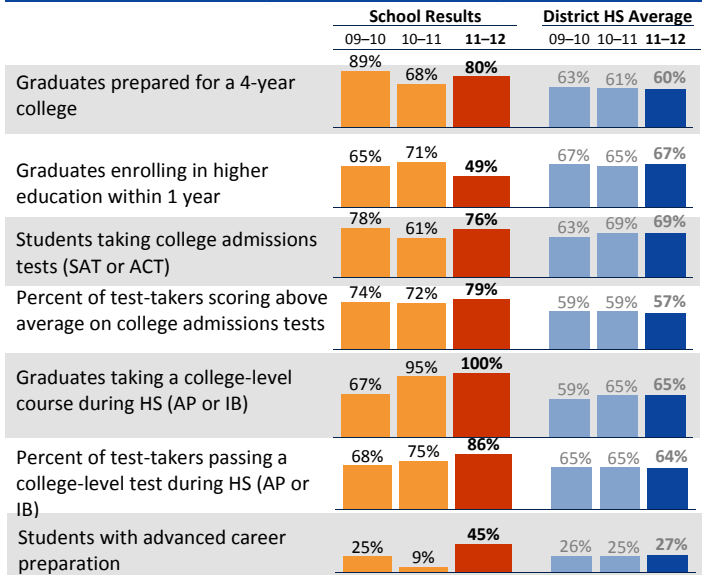
Attendance



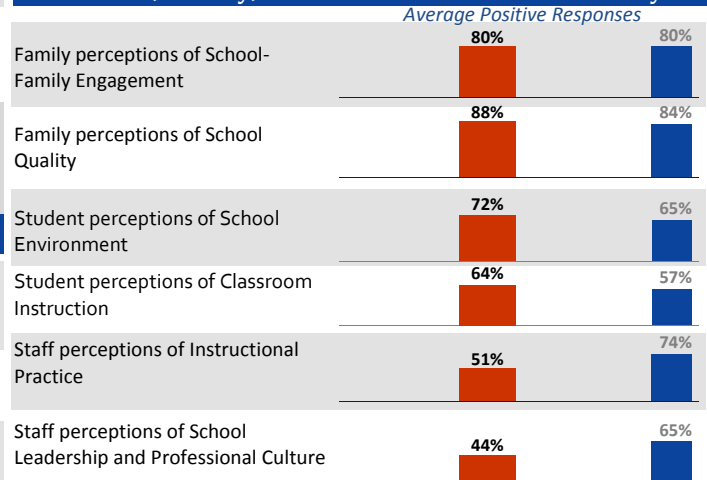
Student Demographics

School Goals

The Center School goals for the 2012-2013 school years include supporting students to earn the equivalent credits each semester to matriculate to the next grade annually. The staff will devote Professional Development time to best instructional strategies analysis. The staff will also align their practices with the District's Framework for exemplar teaching as outlined by Charlotte Danielson. In addition, staff also set the following student centered goals: **Goal 1** – maintain and increase student scores in Mathematics on End of Course State Exam **Goal 2** – increase communication between students within or between classes, as well as move toward staff and students feeling positive about expanded opportunities to be engaged in shared leadership **Goal 3** – student graduation and retention

School Description and Plan to Achieve Goals

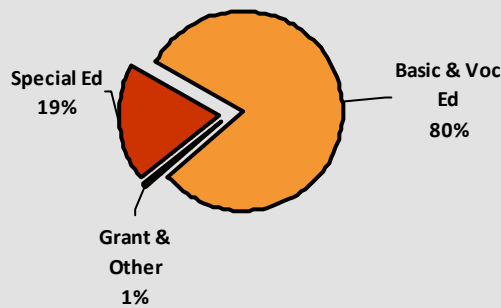
Goal 1 – Math department to work collaborately and utilize technology to help students work on skill gaps if any; hire tutors to support students in Tutorial and Homework Club; introduce a Financial Algebra class as an alternative to Algebra 2, math and Science teachers align vocabulary and mathematical concepts to reinforce the knowledge across the curriculum, as well as conduct an EOC Biology after school class 2nd semester to help students with necessary skills.

Goal 2 – provide opportunities for team-building and focused Community Building meetings, continue with the Positive Behavior Interventions Strategies throughout the school, conduct focus group activities, ensure student participation in staff and Building Leadership Team meetings.

Goal 3 – collect and analyze data to enable us to identify barriers to student academic progress and be purposeful about the interventions we provide for students. Increase the number of minutes in Homework Club (HWC), hire tutors to help out during tutorial and HWC. Provide parents and staff with best strategies on organization and work completion.
