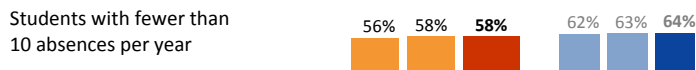
Year-to-Year Growth: Following the Same Students

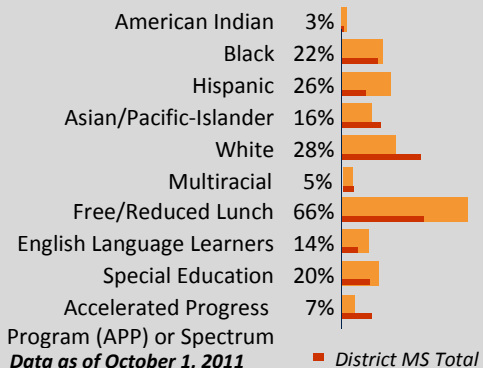

School Mission Statement

Denny International Middle School Mission Statement: Academic Excellence—for Every Student—In Our Global Village. We are preparing every student—without exception—for success in high school, college, and life!

School Goals

Goals: For 6th grade students, we will increase the % of students proficient on the state math test from 60% to 70% and from 64% to 85% for reading. For 7th grade students, we will increase the % of students proficient on the state math test from 60% to 70%, from 59% to 65% for reading and from 72% to 75% for writing. For 8th grade students, we will increase the % of students proficient on the state math test from 69% to 75%, from 62% to 70% for reading and from 62% to 72% for science. We will increase the % of families who report feeling positive about family engagement as measured by the SPS family engagement survey from 71% to 90%.

School Description and Plan to Achieve Goals

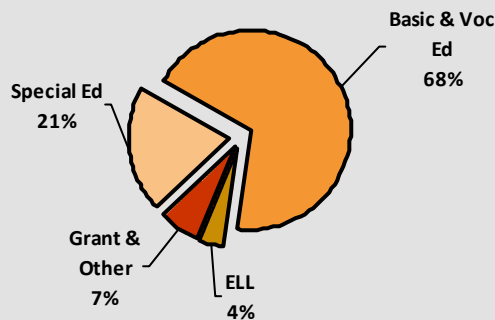
Denny International Middle School is a wonderfully diverse learning community focused on high academic expectations for all students. Our entire school community is committed to providing an outstanding education for each student, eliminating the achievement gap, and infusing the celebration of our diversity into every day of learning.

Strategies for meeting our math goals: Enhance our effective Grade-Level Math Collaboration Meetings. Implement High Leverage Practice Moves in every lesson. Align curriculum, assessment, and instruction 3rd through 10th grade. Enhance the summer bridge program as enrichment to prepare a group of the 7th grade scholars for Algebra and also 6th grade scholars for Spectrum 7th grade math. In addition, continue a summer school program designed for students currently below grade level. Provide data-driven/purposeful after school math classes and Winter and Spring Break programs for students.

Strategies for meeting our literacy goals: Implement Active Literacy and High Leverage Teaching Moves in all literacy classes. Continue to use the Readers' and Writers' approach to literacy with our ongoing partnership with Columbia Teachers' College. Enhance independent reading at the just right level. Provide additional high-quality literacy-based teaching and learning after school, on breaks, and over the summer. Frequently analyze assessment results to adjust lesson planning to match individual student learning needs. Increase tutoring with our many community-based partnerships.
