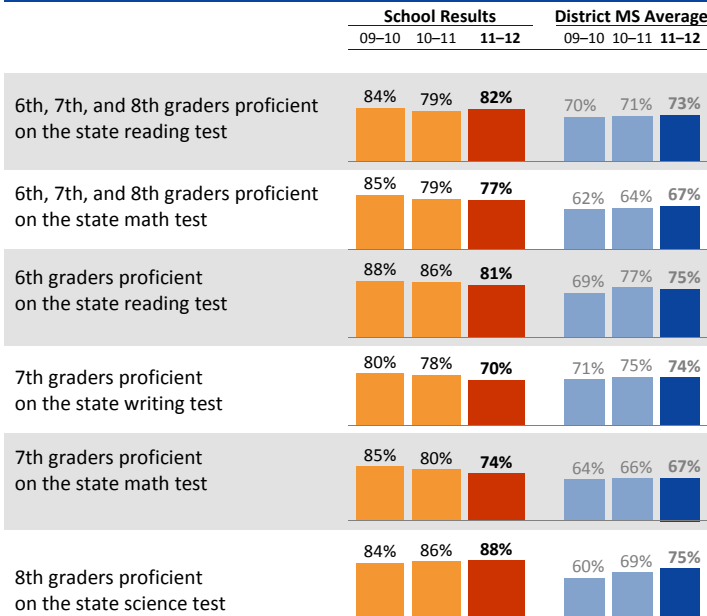

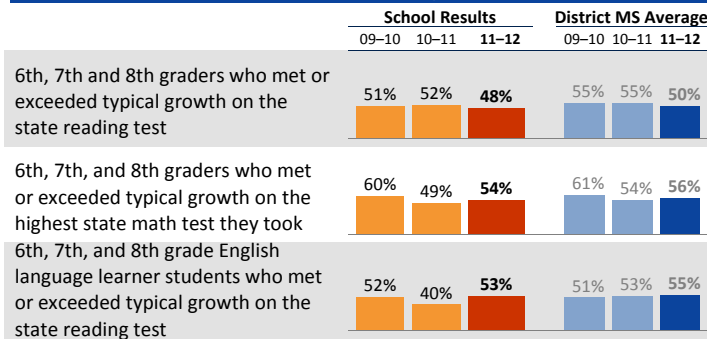

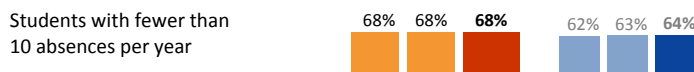


### Year-to-Year Growth: Following the Same Students

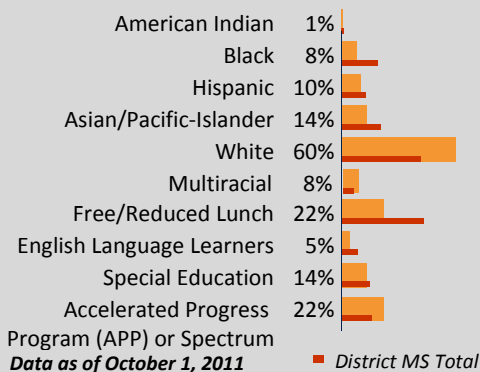

### Student Demographics



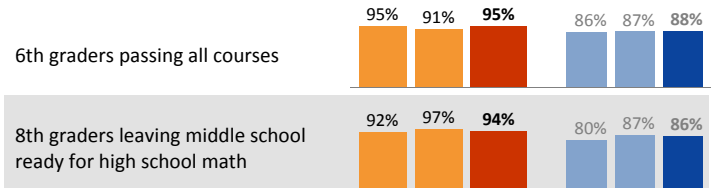

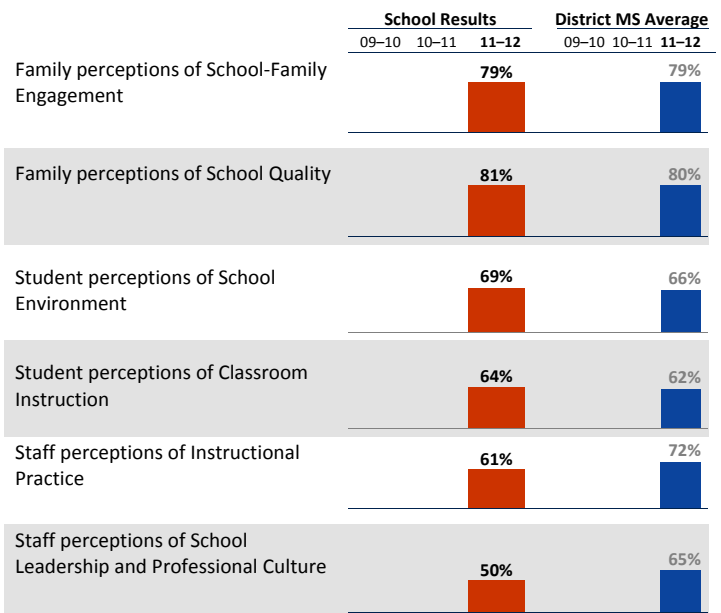

### School Mission Statement

Eckstein is a community of life long learners working together to help students reach their full potential. Graduates are emotionally healthy, self-confident, resilient, and responsible world citizens ready for high school and beyond. By the time they leave Eckstein, all students will read, write and do math at standard or above. Every Student Achieving, Everyone Accountable.

### School Goals

**Math:** On 2013 MSP, “all” students will meet the Annual Measurable Objective (AMO) target of 83.2%; “Black” students will meet the AMO target of 54.1%; “Hispanic” students will meet the AMO target of 65.3%; and Low Income (LI) students will meet the AMO target of 56.5%.

**Reading:** On 2013 MSP, “all” students will meet the AMO target of 82.2%; “Black” students will meet the AMO target of 51.9%; “Hispanic” students will meet the AMO target of 66.2%; and Low Income (LI) students will meet the AMO target of 56.5%.

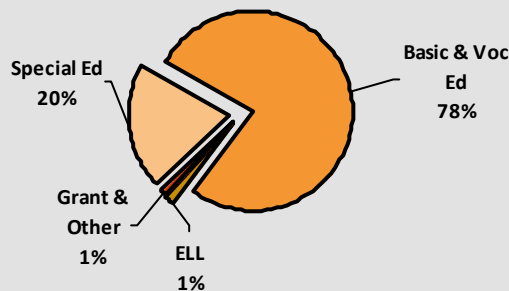
### School Description and Plan to Achieve Goals

**Math:** Teachers will participate in Professional Learning Communities, align curriculum to GLEs, use strategies that increase engagement so all students have clear opportunities to practice and demonstrate mastery, use high leverage instructional practices, implement at least 8 common formative assessments a semester to inform instruction and provide timely student interventions. Students identified as needing math interventions are placed in “I Can Learn,” extended day math, Math Mentorship or homework center. We will also offer camps during school breaks. Homework center is sponsored by the CLC.

**Reading:** Teachers will participate in Professional Learning Communities, align curriculum to GLEs, use strategies that increase engagement so all students have clear opportunities to practice and demonstrate mastery, use high leverage instructional practices, implement at least 8 common formative assessments a semester to inform instruction and provide timely student interventions. Students identified as needing reading interventions will be placed in “Read 180,” extended day reading or homework center. Homework center is sponsored by the CLC.
