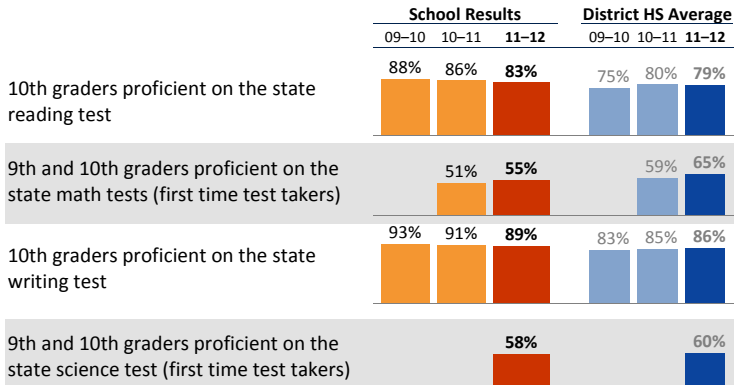

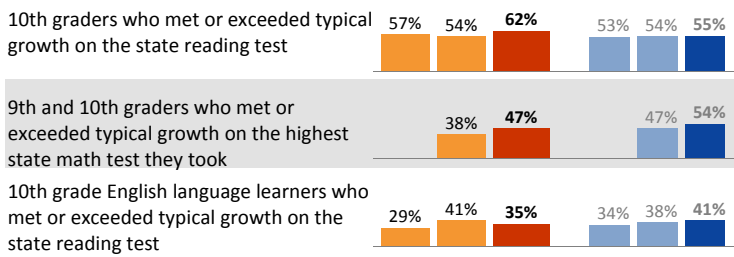

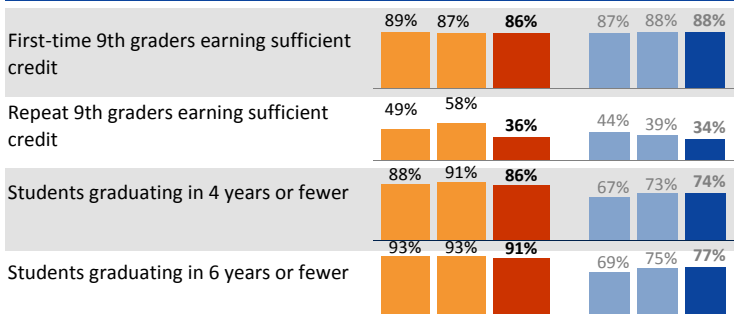


Year-to-Year Growth: Following the Same Students

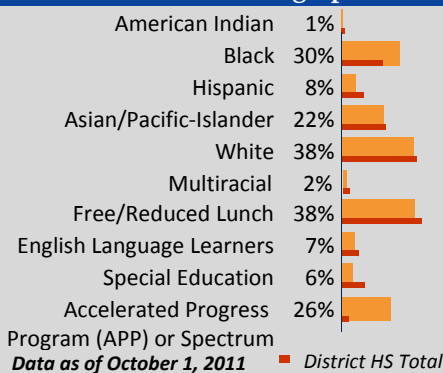
On-Track for Graduation



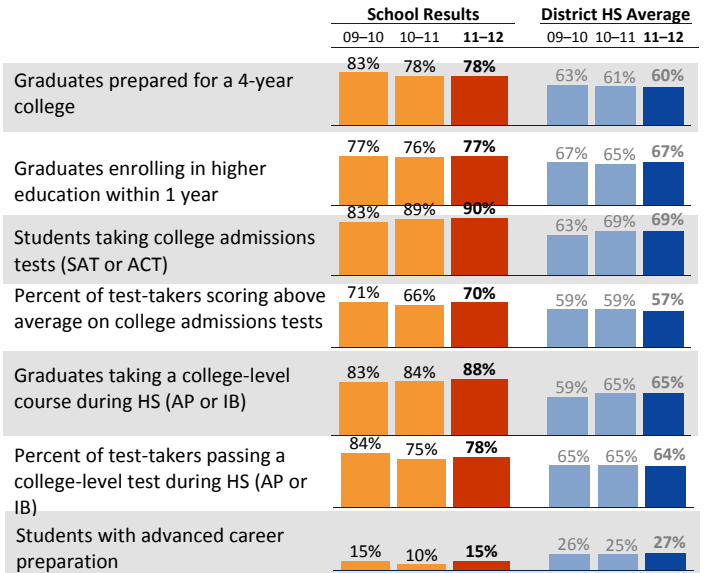
Attendance



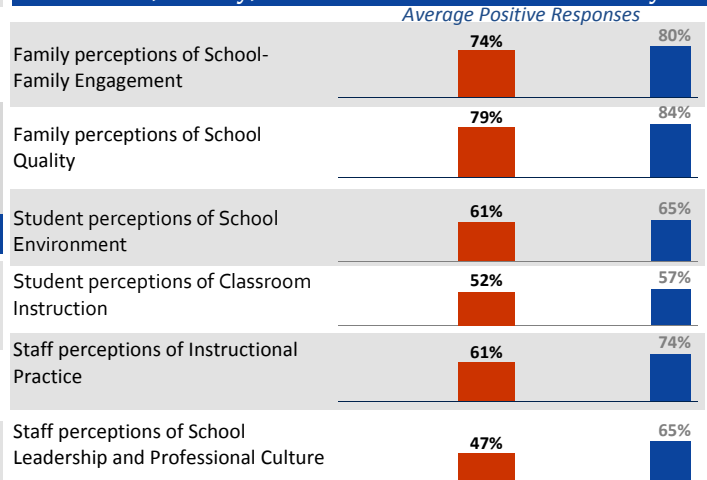
Student Demographics

School Goals

Garfield High School 10th grade students will increase their proficiency in Math, Science, Reading and Writing by 10% on the state HSPE and EOC exams. We will also develop interventions for all ethnic groups who are not meeting standard.

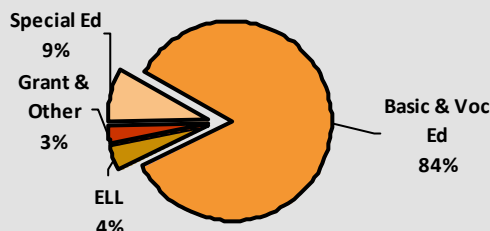
School Description and Plan to Achieve Goals

Math: All Freshman Algebra classes, and Physical Science classes will be limited to 26 or fewer students for the 2012-2013 School Year. Struggling math students at Levels 1 and 2 may be recommended for a math support class. The Academic Dean and the Math Department will identify the appropriate Performance Expectations for each class. The Math and Science (Physical Science teachers) are collaborating on their own time to identify students who need support. Students who have not met standard on unit assessments or EOC exams will be able to access after school tutoring. Struggling students will be monitored for HSPE status and supported with alternatives and strategies to increase success at passage.

Reading: All core classes (Language Arts, Math, History and Science) will focus on the Literacy strategies across the curriculum. Read Right and Read 180 will be our Reading strategies to help address students who have been identified as needing reading support in our school. All Departments at Garfield are using Understanding by Design as an intervention to help support our curriculum standards and student assessments. Garfield is continuing to develop formative and summative assessments to differentiate our instruction to meet the needs of all of our students.
