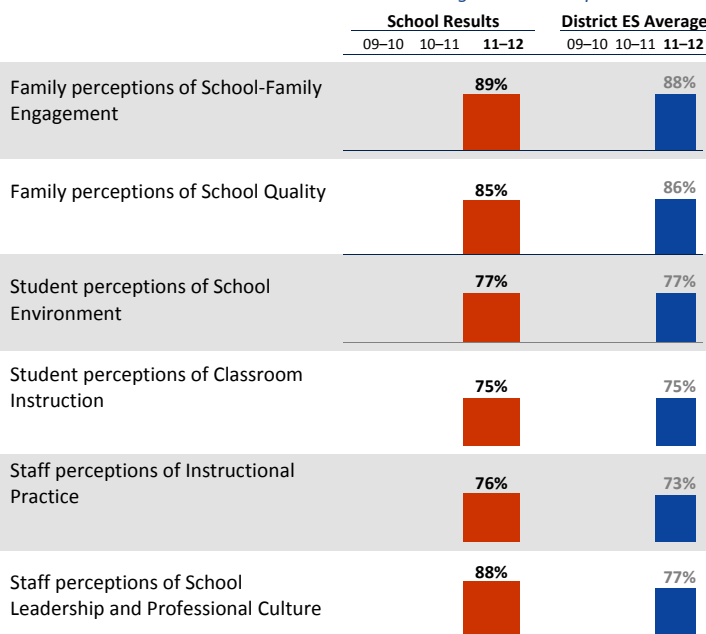

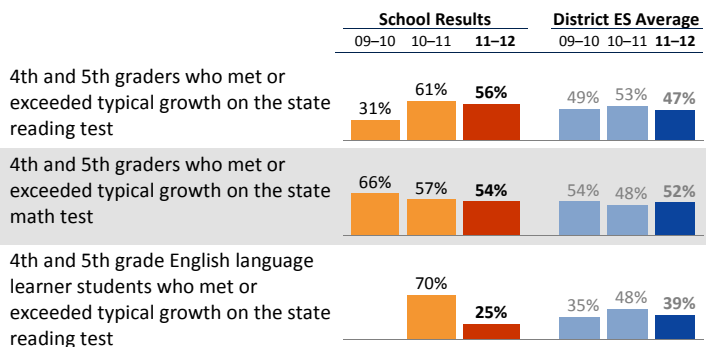

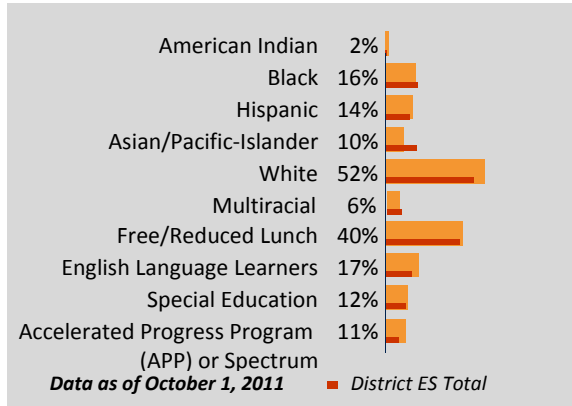

### School Mission Statement

Jane Addams is an environmental science school empowering creative and critical thinkers who nurture themselves, their community, and their environment.

### School Goals

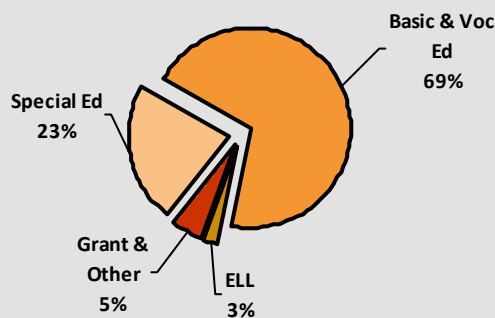
Reading 1. For all 3rd-8th grade students we will increase percentage of students meeting or exceeding typical growth on MAP to 62%. 2. ELL students will increase percentage proficient on state test to 28%, and students on IEPs to 45%. Math 1. For all 3rd-8th grade students we will increase percentage of students meeting or exceeding typical growth on MAP to 50%. 2. ELL students will increase percentage proficient on state test to 31%, and students on IEPs to 47%. Science 1. 8th grade students will maintain proficiency at 75%.

### School Description and Plan to Achieve Goals

Reading Implement Readers' Workshop in all classes. Make use of the leveled classroom libraries for differentiated and individualized support. Balanced Literacy instruction including whole-group mini-lessons, small-group guided/strategy reading, interactive read aloud, and phonics and vocabulary instruction. Math Advanced students will have the opportunity to move up a grade in math. All classes will incorporate the High Leverage Teaching Moves in math, and follow the SPS pacing guide for each grade level.
