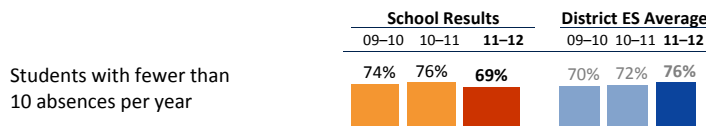

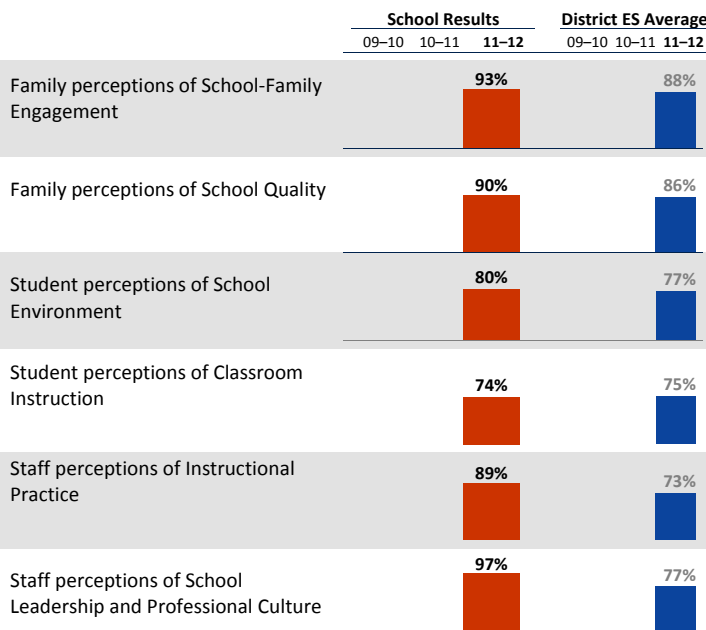

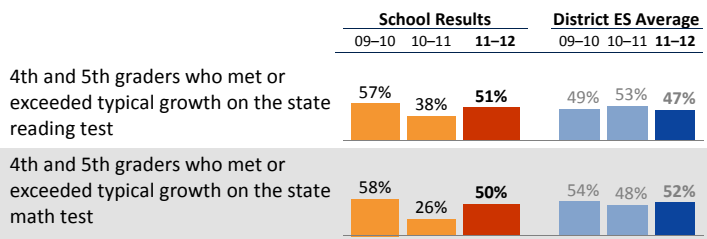
Average Positive Responses

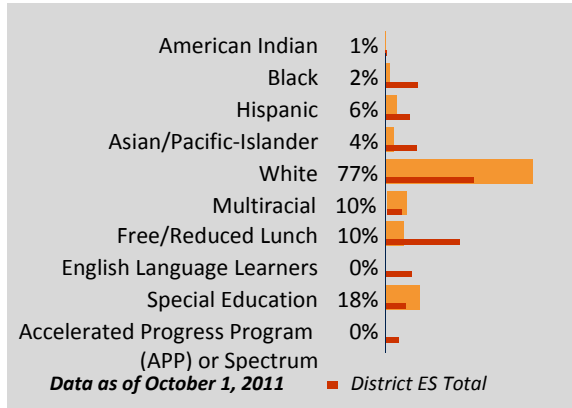
Year-to-Year Growth: Following the Same Students

School Mission Statement

Thornton Creek is an Expeditionary Learning community in which students cultivate their passion for exploration, creativity, and discovery, skills needed to become successful, contributing citizens in our global society.

School Goals

We will increase the % of students in the general program in 3rd, 4th, and 5th grades who are proficient on the state reading test from 92% to 94%. We will increase the % of students in the general program in 3rd, 4th, and 5th grades who are proficient on the state math test from 77% to 85%. We will increase the % of students in the general program in 4th grade who are proficient on the state writing test from 61% to 75%. We will increase the % of 5th grade students who are proficient on the state science test from 81% to 85%.

School Description and Plan to Achieve Goals

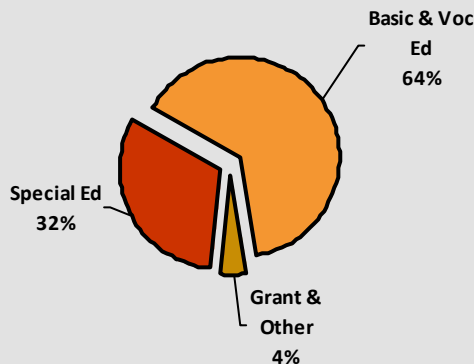
Writing: Teachers will use a portion of our weekly staff meeting to meet in grade level bands to discuss writing instruction seeking feedback to inform instruction. Teachers will examine students' daily writing work and target instruction for individual student needs. Teachers will also examine student's daily work to determine who needs extra writing support from class volunteers or tutors.

Reading: Teachers will use a portion of our weekly staff meeting to meet in grade level bands to discuss reading instruction seeking feedback to inform instruction. Teachers will conference with students' on daily reading and target instruction for individual student needs. Teachers will assess student's daily reading to determine who needs extra reading support from class volunteers or tutors.

Math: Teachers will use a portion of our weekly staff meeting to meet in grade level bands to discuss math instruction and student learning seeking input to inform instruction. Teachers will examine students' daily math work and end of unit data to inform instruction for individual students. Teachers will provide math support using class volunteers. Teachers will discuss what supplemental materials are needed to support students' math achievement.
