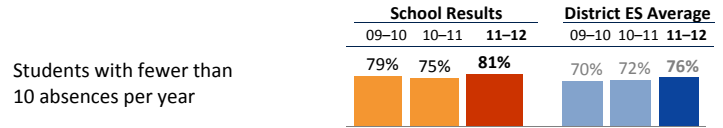

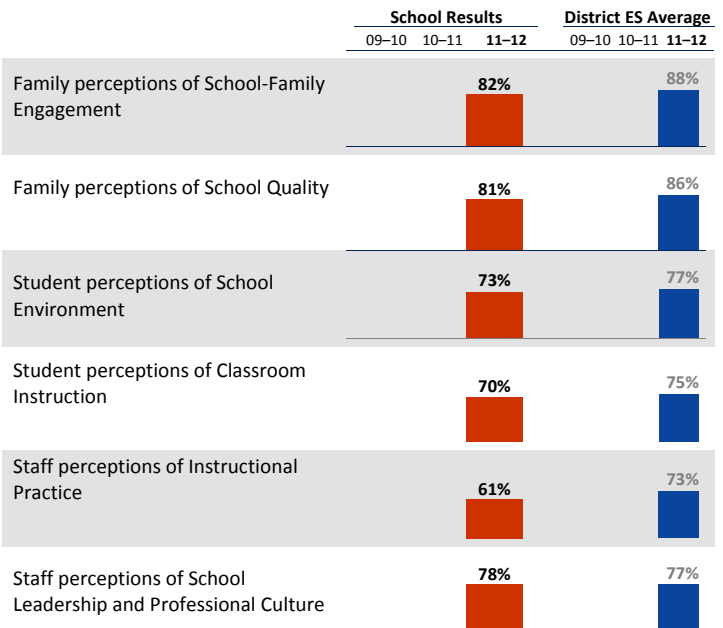

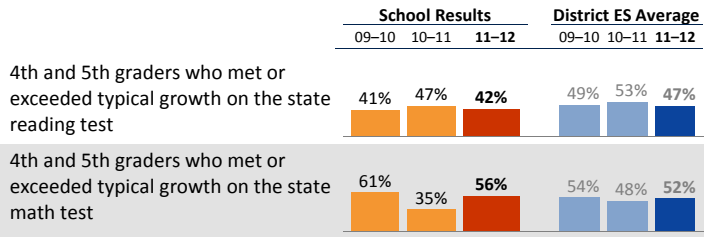

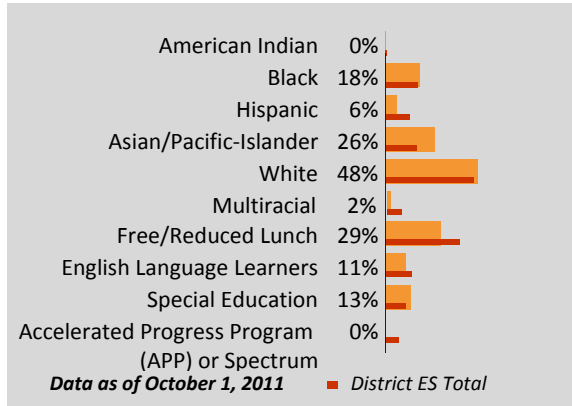
Year-to-Year Growth: Following the Same Students

School Mission Statement

We are committed to educating our students by using an anti-bias multicultural approach in a safe and stimulating environment. We help all students to learn, to understand and honor diversity, to respect and care for themselves and others, to be responsible.

School Goals

MATH: We will increase the % of students meeting or exceeding typical growth on the MAP math test from 28% to 35% for 2nd grade, from 43% to 52% for 3rd grade, from 60% to 75% for 4th grade, from 54% to 67% for 5th grade, from 64% to 80% for 6th grade, from 49% to 61% for 7th grade and from 54% to 68% for 8th grade.

READING: We will increase the % of students meeting or exceeding typical growth on the MAP reading test from 45% to 56% for 2nd grade, from 65% to 82% for 3rd grade, from 60% to 75% for 4th grade, from 67% to 84% for 5th grade, from 53% to 66% for 6th grade, from 64% to 80% for 7th grade and from 63% to 79% for 8th grade.

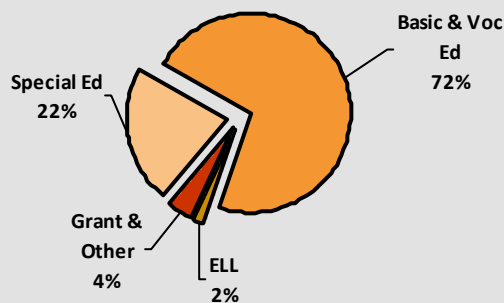
School Description and Plan to Achieve Goals

TOPS is a school that strives to deliver a school experience to students in a manner that embraces the whole child. Integrating the visual and performing arts, athletics and physical education, and experiential learning for all students, we strive to help students embrace diversity and to foster a socially conscious curriculum.

MATH AND READING: Our school improvement goals aim to not only support our Mission and Vision, but also to grow a collaborative culture of adult and student learners. We are working to shift our focus to individual students and away from whole groups. To focus on closing the achievement gap, we are giving special attention to students in targeted subgroups by refining our understanding of research-based interventions and aligning systems of support. We are also strengthening our Professional Learning Communities, and using qualitative and quantitative data to drive our professional practice. Finally, we will continue to implement Reader's and Writer's Workshop.

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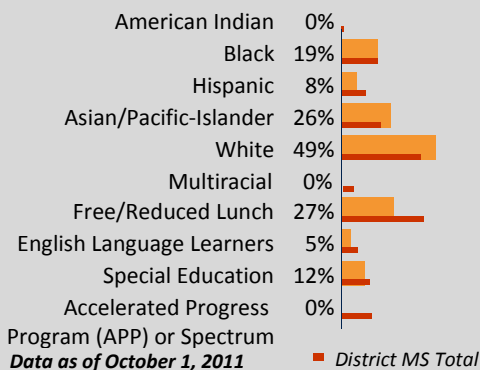
